RESTORATION APPEAL

UPDATE AND END OF FINANCIAL YEAR APPEAL

The St Mary's Restoration project continues to make steady progress, albeit at a slow pace. A donation was received specifically for the church lynch gate (the only one of its kind in WA). The restoration work of the gate has now been carried out by Lyndon & Cameron Grover and is looking magnificent. The gate is a memorial to church members that gave the full measure of devotion to their community, laying down their life defending the freedoms we enjoy today as Australian citizens.

To date, restoration funds stand at \$94,059, consisting of \$28,009 historical savings, \$39,477 received into the National Trust account and a recent State Heritage Grant of \$26,573. Total project costs to restore the building structure (excluding the stain glass windows) stand at \$139,324 based on quotes received to date.

We are now aiming for a further \$60,000 to ensure Beverley's iconic landmark on the highway will remain standing for the next 100-years. Earth and pipe works to improve the drainage of the building has already commenced by local landscape designer James Rodereda.
